This issue of the journal contains within its covers examples of the discussion and debate which helps to ensure that the passion and intellectual rigour of the analysis of existence from philosophical and psychological perspectives continues to enrich our work, and in particular our work in the therapeutic arena. So it is that, for example, we are able to include papers by Professor Thomas Szasz and Anthony Stadlen, which comment on critiques of the work of the former which appeared in *Existential Analysis* 13.2.
